

RESOLUTION 2007-07

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY OF GUSTAVUS, ALASKA, REQUESTING THE LOCAL BOUNDARY COMMISSION DELAY ACCEPTING ANY PETITIONS TO CHANGE SOUTHEAST ALASKA BOROUGH BOUNDARIES

WHEREAS, Gustavus is within a geographic area in which the potential for a proposed Glacier Bay- Chatham Borough is being studied; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gustavus and other affected communities need time to sort out the costs and benefits to their citizens; and


WHEREAS, options for revenue sources for potential new boroughs could be foreclosed during the period of review if existing adjoining boroughs were allowed to place additional lands within their boundaries in the interim;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Gustavus supports a request by communities in the new borough study area to the Local Boundary Commission of Alaska, not to accept any petitions to alter the current borough boundaries in Southeast Alaska, that impinge upon the proposed borough, until such time as generally agreed-upon petitions for borough incorporation are finalized and presented to the Commission.


