

Point of Entry Data


June 6th – August 24th

- 2 State of Alaska Interstate Travel Mandate changes
- 4 different versions of the State Travel Declaration have been used
- 7 Point of Entry Employees were locally hired
- 1234 Point of Entry hours worked were logged
- 80 arrivals were made by the Alaska Airlines Jet
- 6 Alaska Airlines planes canceled
- 46 Alaska Airlines passengers was the busiest day
- 1 Alaska Airlines passenger was the slowest day
- 6 Private plane passengers were processed
- 1271 travelers in total were counted at the Point of Entry Tent
- 1215 travelers arrived on Alaska Airlines
- 56 travelers that arrived by ferry, boat or private plane submitted Travel Declarations
- 850 Interstate Travel Declarations were collected
- 405 Intrastate travelers were counted (we didn't count them for the first week)
- 89% or 756 of the total interstate travelers had tested within 5 days of departure
- 64% or 546 of the total interstate travelers arrived with negative test results within 72 hours
- 13% or 114 of the total interstate travelers arrived with pending test results within 72 hours
- 14 interstate travelers elected to a 14-day quarantine instead of testing
- 256 COVID-19 test performed at the POE tent (including staff)
- 48 follow up testing vouchers were redeemed
- 3 travelers tested positive at the airport testing tent
- 1 traveler flew in with results pending from Arizona and was positive
- 12 of 95 Intrastate travelers from 8/11-8/24 have tested since the Mandate 10 change allowing Alaska residents free tests
